In the 1960's, after a spate of studies on Holocaust survivors, interest ignited on the topic of the trans-generational effects of trauma. The fields of medicine, psychology, law and now genetics are all involved in addressing questions related to trans-generational trauma, such as the types of trauma that are transmitted, the mechanisms of transfer, and the gamut of impacts on the offspring.

This presentation will explore both the generic and personal experiences of children and grandchildren of Holocaust survivors, as a case study of trans-generational trauma *and* resilience.

Ms. Friebaum is currently a Holocaust educator, workshop and training instructor, Coordinating Council member of Generation of the Shoah, International, and vice president of the Phoenix Holocaust Association.
