Tashlich

Following Rosh Hashanah Morning Services

Tashlich is a short but meaningful service done by the shores of a lake, stream, or other body of water. Jews gather the afternoon of the first day of Rosh Hashanah to symbolically cast away the many ways they may have missed the mark over the year. The time is inspired by a verse found in the book of Micha, the prophet, "God will take us back in love; God will vanquish our iniquities and cast our sins into the depths of the sea (7:19).

Directions to Watson Lake Old Boat Ramp

Enter Watson Lake Park at Hwy. 89 Roundabout.

After passing the Entry Kiosk continue for a short distance

and make a Left Turn at the first road you come to.

(There will be an open field to your left)

Follow this road to a Parking Lot. At the Parking Lot there

will be a road on your right that leads down to the Old Boat Ramp.

The road to the ramp is an approximate 2 block walk downhill.

There are two handicap spaces at the ramp. It is suggested that if

the driver can make this walk that passengers may be dropped

off at the ramp and the car then be returned to the parking area.
